



- Ongoing COVID-19 Concerns, Impacts
- FY 21-22 Budget Surplus, Outyear Deficits Projected
- 2021 Legislative Session Underway (Dec. 7th, Jan. 11th)
 - Budgetary Hearings Underway, Likely Decisions in Two Phases
 - Public Access & In Person Access Remains Impacted
 - Policy Bill Load Uncertainty
- Legislature Must Pass Balanced Budget by June 15th
 - 2020 Priority Carryover COVID-19 Impacts/Response/Vaccines, Homelessness, Evictions, Wildfire/Emergency Response
- Multiple Special Elections in 2021
- Legislative Adjournment mid-September 2021

Government Relations

- COLA @ 1.5% for CAEP (~Increase of \$8.1 M)
- \$1M CAEP Technical Assistance Funding
- \$23.2 M GF FY 21-22, \$18 M Ongoing GF for IT Support/Supplies/Bandwidth for ABE, HSE & CC Courses in Jails/Prisons
- Higher education Workforce Investments, COVID-19 Recovery
 - Appears to be Tied to CC/Higher Ed Prop 98 Share, Inquiring...



ASK – Maintain AE Funding & COLA

- During last recession, Adult Education demand increased due to people becoming unemployed and seeking to retrain and improve their skills in order to get back to work quickly.
- Unfortunately, increased demand was met with a significant decrease in supply as local districts, given "categorical flexibility," reduced Adult Education services to adults in order to protect programs for kids.
- While current stagnant funding isn't sufficient to meet growing need, it's critical to maintain – if not grow – current funding amid the COVID-19 pandemic to avoid further erosion of Adult Schools in California.
- Appreciate COLA in the Governor's FY 21-22 January budget proposal - urge the Legislature to continue to include it in its final budget allocation and consider an increased rate to avoid cuts.

- ASK Maintain current funding for the CA Adult Education Program and include the proposed FY 21-22 COLA in the final budget.
- Advocacy also occurring to raise concerns with the COLA level, insufficiency to cover increasing costs...



ASK – Address Funding Distribution & Timing

- Year over year as a result of process issues between CDE and the Community College Chancellor's office, Adult Schools have not received their CAEP funding until more than half way through the school year.
- While school districts have been willing to float Adult Schools, as school district budgets tighten amid the COVID-19 pandemic they've been clear this cannot continue and Adult Schools will be left without access to funding they are allocated July 1st each year based on budget and consortium plans.
- ASK In accordance with funding decisions made by consortia in their plans, establish a line item in the CDE budget to distribute Adult School funding directly to adult schools as provided in the CAEP regional plans.



ASK – Develop Carryover Criteria for CAEP Funding

- Each year, consortia must certify expenditures for the prior school year by October 31st
- Beginning in FY 21-22, 15% consortium carryover cap in any given year
- Any consortium carrying over more than 15% of its annual allocation will have allocation reduced by the amount exceeding 15% carry over in the following year
- Unspent consortium dollars will be made available for one-time expenses in other regions and/or technical assistance.
- Technical assistance will be provided to any consortium with excess carryover in order to ensure needs of the region are addressed in future years.

 ASK – To ensure CAEP carryover funds have an established plan for expenditure, the Legislature should establish clear criteria to guide acceptable levels and reasons for carryover to ensure funding is directed to addressing needs and gaps in service to the greatest extent possible.



ASK – Education Code Updates

K12 Adult Education has changed significantly since its inception, but the **Education Code has not** been updated to reflect the current system and delivery of services in conjunction with its partners.

 ASK – Update and align Education Code for K12 Adult Schools to better reflect the current system and program delivery under the CA Adult Education Program (CAEP).

Governor's Proposed Budget 21 -



- 2020-21 Allocation: \$538,564,000
- Proposed Increase (1.4999%): \$8,078,000
- 2021-22 Allocation: \$546,642,000

All numbers subject to change at the May Revise

Governor's Proposed Budget 21



- 2021-22 Total : \$546,642,000
- + Data & Acct. : \$5,000,000
- + Increase to D/A: \$1,000,000
- Grand Total in Budget: \$552,642,000
- * \$552,642,000 is the line item for adult education in the Governor's proposed budget.

2021-2022 Allocation Process



- February Release of CAEP Preliminary Allocations for 2021
 2022
- March April public meetings to decide allocations
- May 2nd CFAD due in NOVA
- May Revise
- June Governor's Budget Signed
- August Release of funds

Member Effectiveness



- CAEP Reminder Memo on Member Requirements (minimum threshold).
- Process will go into effect for the 21 -22 program year.
- Requirements are the assurances that members certify as part of the CFAD process.
- We encourage consortia to continue exploring how to define member effectiveness (see afternoon session).

Member Effectiveness (cont.)



- NOVA will create member reports for consortium directors for follow -up.
- CAEP TAP and the State CAEP Office will track member deliverables (NOVA reports, and CASAS data reporting).
- Process includes reminders, outreach to consortia directors, offers of technical assistance, and if all else fails — ineffective member status.
- Aligns with CAEP education code on reducing a member's funding for being ineffective.

- Coming soon in 2021 Communities of Practice
- CAEP TAP will release Summit recordings and research briefs.
- Available for stakeholder discussions News & Review Publications

3-Year Planning



- Guidance on 3 Year Planning will roll later this Spring/Summer
- New plans will be due June 2022
- 3-year plans will be entered into NOVA aligns with the consortium annual plan, member work plans & budgets.
- 3-year plans will also include member level goal setting and targets (aligning with the WIOA II continuous improvement plan (CIP).

3-Year Planning (cont.)



- Plans & targets will be updated annually (part of the annual plan process).
- 21-22 will also include a Governance Certification Process due with the CFAD in May 2022.
